At Roll The Dice, we are passionate about the use of games for good and are developing an offering which supports children and young people's S.E.M.H.

Roll The Dice aims to provide the opportunity for young people to explore the world of tabletop gaming, regardless of their experience. Our space is designed to be welcoming and friendly, as well as conducive to developing creative and logistic skills, allowing imagination to flow and friendships to be formed.

Game Therapy is very much a new provision that serves our children and young people. Through the use of Tabletop Role Playing Games (TTRPGs), practitioners are able to improve the S.E.M.H. of the children and young people they work with.

At Roll The Dice, we have a number of different game systems including the Game to Grow method of delivery which is research backed and has proven track record (Kilmer, et al., 2023).

#### What is a TTRPG?

It is a collaborative and fun activity in which players are facilitated by a game master to follow a formal set of rules and participation structures, role-playing as characters to create a story together.

#### Why are TTRPGs a useful therapeutic tool?

- Roleplaying in the game allows the participants to practice the skills that they need to develop.
- Character creation allow the participants to express their thoughts and feelings through a third party.
- Character success and growth can be translated to player success and growth.
- Through playing as characters, participants can express inner thoughts, see things from different viewpoints and gain new insights.
- Players want to continue to play!
- · Playing naturally encourages positive social interactions.

(Davis & Johns, 2020; Connell, Kilmer & Kilmer, 2020; Goodall & Truong, 2021)

Using this approach allows us to move from a social deficit model to a social flourishing model (Kilmer, et al., 2023):
