We had a call from one of the school's neighbours. Apparently, some cars are reversing and turning in their driveways.

We wanted to make all parents (including those attending Owlets) aware of the very real problems that can arise from inconsiderate parking outside the school, particularly at morning drop off.

<u>Attendance</u>

It is essential for children to attend school regularly in order to maximise the opportunities available to them.

Regular attendance is important because it affects learning. Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their learning, as well as disrupting teaching routines which will inevitably cause gaps in learning and limit progress.

We monitor attendance on a regular basis and will send out letters to parents today where attendance is below 95%, 93% and 90% respectively. We will arrange meetings with parents to discuss any concerns if needed.

You will be aware that we provide weekly attendance information on the school newsletter, which we hope you find useful.

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scables	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
